#### **SYLLABUS**

**Title of the Course**: IED 447 Comparative Literature

**Course Description:** The objective in the intensive study of four representative novels, a short story, and a feature film, along with related secondary sources will be to compare changing attitudes towards adultery across time — from the mid 19<sup>th</sup> century to our day — and across cultures, namely American, French, Russian, Turkish and British. The life and major works of each writer will be briefly examined. The sociocultural background of each epoch and country will be analysed with reference to men-women relationships, gender issues, women's status and moral, legal and religious measures with regard to marriage and divorce. In addition, the technical and stylistic contribution of each novelist will be thoroughly studied. Finally, the approach of each writer in presenting the wife as adulteress will be — compared and evaluated within the social and cultural context of their time.
